COVID-19 Resource Round-up

Antiviral treatment (Paxlovid) for higher-risk individuals with COVID-19

This is a reminder that treatment is available to help prevent serious illness from COVID-19 *if taken within 5 days of the start of symptoms*. Your risk of serious illness is based on your health, age, vaccination status and assessment from a healthcare provider. You might be at higher risk if you are: immunocompromised, 70 or older, unvaccinated or not up to date with boosters, or have a health condition such as diabetes, obesity, heart disease, hypertension, pregnancy, amongst others. If you are high risk and suspect you have COVID-19, visit a <u>clinical assessment centre</u> or talk to your pharmacist or doctor about Paxlovid *as soon as symptoms present*. <u>COVID-19 antiviral treatment screener</u>.

Seasonal Flu Shots - Help us Update vour Record

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If you have received your annual flu vaccine at a location outside of the West Carleton FHT (eg. a pharmacy or public health clinic), please help us update your record by reporting your flu vaccine to us in the <u>Patient Portal</u>. Once logged in, you'll see a link to report your flu vaccine (above the photo tiles). Still need to get your annual flu shot? <u>Visit Ottawa Public Health for locations</u>.

Patients with upcoming appointments can also receive their flu shot in our office at the time of their appointment, as vaccine availability permits or schedule an appointment in an upcoming immunization clinic.

Mental Health Support for Healthcare Workers

Throughout the pandemic, the Ministry of Health and Ontario Health have partnered with five hospitals to provide mental health services to frontline health care workers. CAMH and their partner hospitals are currently providing access to mental health and addiction supports for these workers dealing with the stressors of COVID-19. CAMH is now expanding these supports to help health care workers maintain their mental health and wellness while coping with a wide array of stressors, including the pandemic OR other crises. These services include access to resources, Cognitive Behavioural Therapies (CBT/Psychotherapy) as well as Psychiatric Services.

Individuals who meet the following criteria are now eligible to self-refer for psychotherapy and psychiatric services:

- You are a health care worker in Ontario; and
- You require mental health and/or addictions support.
